



7th Grade Supply List 2016-2017

All students should bring the following items to school every day:

- A three inch three ring binder, which should include subject dividers to separate classes (we recommend dividers that contain pockets to allow for additional storage).
- Plenty of loose leaf paper in each section of the binder (you must keep loose leaf at home to resupply as needed)
- 1 homework planner that includes a calendar (note that these can be purchased through the Office of Student Services)
- 2 Black pens (the only color for Social Studies); blue is acceptable in other classes.
- 2 pencils
- 1 separate eraser for backup
- 1 portable pencil sharpener
- 1 dual-sided ruler (6in./15cm)
- 1 clear plastic protractor
- 1 drawing compass (for Math)
- Plenty of tracing paper and graphing paper (for Math)
- 1 yellow highlighter (for Social Studies)
- 1 green highlighter (for Social Studies)
- 1 orange highlighter (for Social Studies)
- 1 box of colored pencils

In addition, we ask that students bring the following items on the first day of school, which will be collected by teachers:

- All summer reading assignments. Each should be completed on separate pieces of paper to be turned in to different teachers.
- 1 box of tissues

NOTE ABOUT BINDERS: It is essential that students come to class with a binder to take notes, and in which they have written their notes from previous classes. We require a three ring binder because it allows students to add/remove paper easily. Because there will not be time in between classes to get supplies from lockers, students should keep this binder with them at all times. Students may elect to carry two separate binders, one for classes before lunch and one for classes afterwards, so that they can be exchanged during the lunchtime transition. However, all 7th graders are required to arrive at different classes with all necessary materials. Teachers will let students know when they can take old notes out of their binder and store them at home for later review.

NOTE ABOUT PLANNERS: 7th graders must bring planners to every class every day in order to be successful. This planner should not just another page in a student's binder; instead, it should be a separate, designated notebook that students use to plan all of their responsibilities. Some projects will require long-term preparation, so this planner should include a calendar so that students can plan ahead. Because parent involvement is essential to student success, we encourage parents to review their student's planners regularly so that everyone understands what is expected of 7th graders.
